FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Beloved in Christ,

Pope Francis invites us as Church to focus intensely on the undeserved gift of mercy during the Season of Lent. Mercy is a pure gift based on love. Our Father sent His Son out of love for us, so that we, unmerited sinners, may have an outpouring of mercy by the blood of Jesus on the cross (*Jn. 3:16*). Whereas we are condemned by the law, mercy sets us free and spurs new hope and joy (*Rom. 15:13*).

Our Pope's intention behind the renewed reflection and re-appreciation on mercy is twofold: to make the Church a visible sign of the Lord who seeks out and happily welcomes home those who have gone astray; and to inculcate a sense of praise for our God who makes us new (*Rv. 21:5*). The former is to encourage Catholics to return home. Since the love of Christ conquers all things, then there is no sin too great that our Lord won't forgive, and consequently this love restores our relationship with Him and the Church.

The second premise is an invitation for all believers to personally acknowledge the beauty of our eternal salvation. Scripture says, "With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption" (*Ps. 130:7*). The individual who, first-hand, experiences God's mercy — which gives comfort and consolation — is the one who finds joy. The believer cannot save oneself. By acknowledging the truth that only God saves, the believer embraces this gift and seeks to please God by being merciful with others. Jesus confirms this attitude when He said, "Be merciful as your Father is merciful" (*Lk. 6:36*).

The mercy of the Lord wipes the slates of our lives clean. Love bears no record of wrong (1 Cor. 13:5). When God exercises mercy, He washes away all our past and present sins (Ps. 51:2) and gives us a fresh start. He is able because He shows in today's gospel that He is the only one who was tempted but never yielded nor sinned (Lk. 4:1-13). The spotless Lamb has shed His blood so that sinners may be redeemed and a new beginning can be constructed.

As recipients of God's mercy, we are invited to share this mercy with others. To the unspiritual, this is foolish, but to the forgiven believer, this is life.
