FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Beloved,

The truths that are presented in the Bible form the basis of our faith. They are viewed as God's revelations which point the way to how we live, and what we practise and believe. God reveals His will and plan so that we may come to a deeper appreciation of His love. By embracing what is required, we then experience a real peace that surpasses all our understanding (*Phil. 4:7*) which the world cannot impart. Today's gospel (*Jn. 2:1-11*) highlights three truths that believers should recognize as being beneficial in advancing God's kingdom and living as children of our Heavenly Father.

The first truth to glean is that marriage is blessed and sanctified by God. The presence of Jesus at the wedding in Cana is an affirmation of the view that a man leaves his parents and clings to his wife, and the two become one flesh (*Gn. 2:24*). This mystery of the unity of love is meant to be a sign of our oneness in Christ and His unity with us. Marriage is the bond that liturgically and legally cements the commitment that the couple makes to live a life of faithful love. It is to mirror the union of Christ for His bride the Church. Our children are to be taught that the way to build families is through marriage.

The second truth to appreciate is the role of Mary in God's plan of salvation. Mary was chosen to be the mother of Jesus and she consented (*Lk. 1:38*). She was to be called blessed by every generation (*Lk. 1:48*) even though she was told early that a sword will pierce her soul (*Lk. 2:35*). Her journeying with her son would bring joy and suffering. As the mother of Jesus, she shares a unique bond that no other human being claims. Jesus was indeed flesh of her flesh and bone of her bone (*Gn. 2:23*). It is in this context that Mary is given a special place in having the ear and heart of her son. She saw that more wine was needed, and she brought it to the attention of Jesus. She then left him and told the servants to do what Jesus required (*Jn. 2:5*). At Cana, Mary's role as intercessor is illuminated, and we who have recourse to her, can take courage and have confidence that she will see and hear our cries and take them to Jesus.

The third truth to embrace is the use of signs and symbols to express realities that unfold over time which draw us deeper into the mystery of God. When Mary shared that more wine was needed, Jesus said that his "hour had not yet come" (*Jn. 2:4*). This hour was referring to the time of his crucifixion. Prior to that event, Jesus would bless a cup of wine at the last supper with his Disciples, and give it as his blood for the forgiveness of sins. The miracle of more wine at Cana came from the water in the jars used for purification rites. The gift of wine becoming Jesus' blood is given to purify us from our sins. The eternal hour of sacrifice is enshrined in every celebration of Mass when wine becomes the blood of Christ for our eternal salvation.

May we allow the love of God, the beauty of scripture and the grace of the sacraments to lead us always into the joys of His everlasting kingdom.
